National Titles Selection Policy

Ratified July 2013

Reviewed July 2014

This policy outlines the process of selecting athletes for the NSW state representative team. The strategic aim of the policy is for NSW to win the maximum number of titles available at the Australian National Boccia Titles and the overall Champion State Shield, in addition to developing new talent.

1. Boccia Australia will set the total number of athletes from each state is allowed to register for the National titles
2. The NSW selectors will consist of the NSW coaches and the Boccia NSW President or their nominees.
3. The selectors will allocate places to the six classifications: BC1, BC2, BC3, BC4, BC5 and EMU.
4. The process for selection will be as follows:
 - 4.1. September all clubs will be notified of selection process and criteria
 - 4.2. November separate selection days will be held for rampers and throwers.
 - 4.3. A training squad will be selected and regular training sessions held.
 - 4.4. Final selection will be made, according to criteria outlined below, from the training squad following the NSW state titles
5. The following criteria will be applied:
 - 5.1. The athlete must have demonstrated skills in game play, including decision making and strategic thinking, application of BisFed rules, communication, team work and high skill playing level.
 - 5.2. The athlete must have attended the selection day held in November*
 - 5.3. The athletes must have completed in the NSW state titles* and demonstrated a consistent level of performance
 - 5.4. The athlete must accept the offer of a place within the team, agreeing to all conditions, within 2 weeks of the offer with complete registration payment as outlined in the letter of offer.

* Exception may be made if athlete can demonstrate valid reason for non-attendance eg production of medical certificate



5.5. If the place is rejected than an alternative athlete will be offered the place and the same criteria will apply.

The selected team will be announced as soon as all places have been confirmed.

Tribunal Procedure

An athlete not selected may make an appeal to the Boccia NSW Committee in writing within one week of the announcement of the selected team. The appeal will be reviewed by a panel of three Boccia NSW Committee members. This will include the President and two other current members not involved in the selection of the original team.
